MIRAGOANE, HAITI, 2016 Mission accomplished for the IRIS Mundial volunteers

By Dr. Francine Lavallée and Dr. Marie-France Duguay, optometrists- On May 3rd, IRIS Mundial volunteers returned from Haiti with a strong sense of accomplishment. 1,725 individuals were examined in the course of this one-week mission in Miragoane, a small town about three car hours from the capital, Port-au-Prince. The people live in precarious conditions and their visual needs are great as there were no eye care services in the area until the arrival of the IRIS Mundial team.

Visual care for 1725 people among the poorest

We are delighted and proud of the work done by our multidisciplinary team of **28 Canadian and Haitian volunteers**. After transporting the luggage, equipment, eyewear and medication trays, the team moved into the Miragoane SteTherese Hospital premises. Ophthalmologists, optometrists, opticians, a medical doctor, nurses and assistants worked tirelessly, for long days, despite the heat, with incredible energy. Haitian nurses and assistants working for the IRIS Mundial permanent eye care programs in Limbe and Labrousse also joined the Canadian team.

It would have taken much more than five days to meet all patients in need; some walked for several hours under a blazing sun to reach us. The volunteer professionals examined more than 1725 people and 1,500 of them received prescription eyewear, which will allow some to work, others to study or simply help them carry out their daily activities. For most of them, it was their first eyewear. All received sun protection against ultraviolet radiation, which often leads to cataracts and/or pterygium.

Changing lives through the gift of sight

1725 stories could be told thanks to the colossal work of this caring, devoted and determined volunteer team providing quality health care to disadvantaged people. It's through little stories that our intervention makes sense, when lives are transformed by the gift of sight ... Chrisbeline, a seven year-old girl, received prescription glasses of -14.00 diopters after her eye exam. The girl will soon have the chance to receive a pair of glasses perfectly adapted to her view, courtesy of Nikon Optical Laboratories. "You can leave the hand of your daughter; she can walk alone now," Elizabeth Duncan, optician and director of the dispensary, told the mother of this little girl.

Awareness of visual impairment

The main objective of the mission was to educate the population and medical authorities about visual problems, and make them aware that most visual impairments can be avoided or cured simply with a pair of glasses or ocular surgery. "Glaucoma screening for each patient helped prevent blindness in several patients; these people didn't suspect that their vision was in jeopardy because of this endemic disease in Haiti." says Dr. Francine Lavallée, optometrist and director of visual care More than 200 patients with eye diseases had the opportunity to be examined by volunteer ophthalmologists as well as receiving advice and eye medication. Patients with cataracts will be operated in the coming weeks by a Haitian ophthalmologist thanks to an IRIS Mundial special grant.

The challenge of this mission in Haiti, the poorest country in the Americas, was successfully met; people will remember the visit of our team for a long time. The contacts established will help with the implementation of permanent ophthalmological services.

THE PROGRAMS OF IRIS MUNDIAL: Access for thousands of Haitians to visual

Labrousse PPFB results

As of August 2016 Consolidation phase III: October 2015 to September 2017

- ·1544 students screened in schools
- · 924 adults screened in mobile clinics or at the permanent clinic in Labrousse
- ·221 complete eye examinations carried out and 8 eye surgeries carried out
- ·166 pairs of eyeglasses provided and 369 medications distributed

The Labrousse program is currently in a restructuring phase until the end of 2016, in order to develop a model better adapted to the reality of the area.

Follow-up mission in Labrousse

Last May, a one-week follow-up mission was run by the General Managers of the permanent eyecare program in Labrousse, Mrs. Miriame Cadet and Mr. Maxi Marcelin. Despite the heavy rains that made the roads impassable, the trip went well. Several activities were carried out: follow-up of the program objectives, implementation of mobilization strategies for mobile clinics, follow-up of visual tools printing, inventory and selection of equipment, screening patients in a school and in an isolated location, etc. A meeting was also organized with Doctor Gracia Lenode, director of the Notre-Dame-de-Lourdes de Labrousse health center, concerning the objectives of the program and better integration of eye care with other health services available.

Ophthalmology internship for the PPFB nurses

Thanks to our partners, *Orlo* Clinic in Port-au-Prince and *Vision Plus* Clinic in Cap-Haïtien, the head nurses of the two IRIS Mundial permanent programs in Haiti had the opportunity to experience an ophthalmology internship last spring, in order to improve their knowledge and skills in eyecare. Mrs. Miriame Cadet, head nurse of the Labrousse PPFB, told us that she liked attending surgeries. This will help her to more aware and prepare the patients who will undergo eye surgery. Mrs. Nadia Bazil, head nurse of the Limbe PPFB, told us: "I had the chance to observe the work methods of other healthcare employees... [...] I think that the training will help me a lot in my work, I feel better equipped." Thanks to our partners who made possible this internship!

History

Eager to offer visual services throughout the year, IRIS Mundial has implemented two "Programs for the Prevention and Fight against Blindness (PPFB)" that aims to make available a quality eye care system to the most disadvantaged population located in isolated areas. The field teams are working tirelessly to enable thousands of people each year to experience better vision.

The opening of new premises for the Limbe PPFB

We are pleased to announce that the teammates of the Limbe permanent program now have new premises in the Village of Hope (CEDI-VE). This mores spacious building, funded by IRIS Mundial, was inaugurated last June. New ophthalmic equipment will be sent shortly, and the centre will offer a larger range of services to the population. One aspect of the current consolidation phase is to optimize and equip the permanent evecare clinic. This second phase is possible through a grant from the Quebec International Development Program and the Roncalli International Foundation.

Manager without borders internship in Limbe

From May to August 2016, Marie-Laurence Bordeleau, a Manager without borders intern, stayed at the Village of Hope (CEDI-VE) in Limbe, Haiti. As an organizational capacity building advisor, she helped the PPFB's team to better manage the different aspects of the program, by identifying issues, making recommendations and providing training. Marie-Laurence has a secondary school baccalaureate and is finishing an International Development Management masters program. Her dynamism and leadership were major assets for the local teammates. This is what she had to say about her experience:

"It's hard to describe Haiti for those who have never been there. My few months experience in this country can be described by perfumes, landscapes and smiles. It was a fourteen-week love story; it was about getting to know others, seeing beauty in dirt and the good in poverty. Without communication technologies, Haiti forced me to forget the rest of the world and focus on the here and now. The progress made by the organization and the impact of the projects on the Limbe community are undeniable. The presence of the service-users, day after day, proves that there is a real need to fill. In the end, my summer at the PPFB helped me to better understand the issues surrounding development projects. I will always be grateful to IRIS Mundial for giving me this opportunity to grow as a young volunteer! "- Marie-Laurence Bordeleau

Pediatric eye screening mission in Haiti

IRIS Mundial joined the ophthalmology residents from the University of Montreal

From January 30thto February 6th, a pediatric eye screening mission took place in the north of Haiti through the Montreal University Group for Haitians with Glaucoma (GUHG). The main objective was to collect epidemiological data on visual problems in children aged between 3 to 6 years. The team of the IRIS Mundial Program for Prevention and Fight against Blindness (PPFB) and Doctor Pierre Martin, an IRIS Mundial optometrist volunteer, joined forces with the GUHG to make this mission a great success!

An undoubted impact

During the four days of work, more than 600 people were examined in two schools. Cases of congenital ptosis, strabismus, congenital coloboma as well as children at risk from glaucoma were observed during the week. More than thirty Haitian young people received eyewear cut in Quebec, sent to them last spring thanks to the teammates of the IRIS Mundial Limbe PPFB.

The GUHG members benefited from the expertise of Doctor Martin, who has participated in more than 10 IRIS Mundial abroad missions, for the supply of eyewear, the logistics of the clinics, the Haitian culture, etc. The PPFB teammates, meanwhile, participated in the planning of the mission, as well as taking visual acuity and translating from Creole. "It is especially thanks to IRIS Mundial and its PPFB that contacts with schools were made. It is with the precious collaboration of [the PPFB and its coordinator] Elvie Maxineau [...] that all families of children assessed were notified. "-Doctor Martin, optometrist.
